CALL TO ORDER

SALUTE TO COLORS

Mayor Maio invited all those present to stand in a salute to the colors.

MAYOR'S STATEMENT AS TO COMPLIANCE WITH P.L. 1975

Adequate Notice of this Meeting has been provided according to the Open Public Meetings Act, Assembly Bill 1030. Notice of this Meeting was included in the Annual Meeting Notice sent to the New Jersey Herald and the Daily Record on January 7, 2015 and was placed on the Official Bulletin Board in the Municipal Building.

In the event the Mayor and Council have not addressed all items on this Agenda by 11:00 PM and they are of the opinion that they cannot complete the Agenda in a reasonable time period, the Mayor and Council may exercise their option to continue this meeting at an agreed to date, time and place within ten (10) days of this meeting. ENGINEER'S REPORT – Administrator McNeilly stated Mr. Keller was unable to attend tonight's meeting. No report was available.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

<u>Property Sale</u> – Administrator McNeilly reported he met with Judy Togno, Weichert Realtor, to prepare for the upcoming property auction. The properties to be auctioned are located on Main Street, Kynor Avenue and Leo Avenue. An ordinance will have to be introduced by the end of the month to allow the auction to take place at the March 24th business meeting.

<u>Energy Aggregation</u> – Administrator McNeilly reported the next energy auction will take place on January 21st at 11:00 A.M. If the rates are favorable and the co-op accepts the rate, the Borough will have to hold a special meeting to authorize the signing of the agreement. Administrator McNeilly stated Mr. Stein has recommended that Concord Engineering provide a resolution to be placed on the agenda in the event the rates are acceptable. The signed agreements would have to be received by Concord Engineering no later than 4:00 P.M. on January 27th. The Governing Body agreed to hold a special meeting on January 21st at 5:30 P.M. in the event the pricing is favorable. Mayor Maio asked the Deputy Clerk to inform the Clerk of the meeting date to be advertised.

<u>Sussex County Communication Center</u> – Administrator McNeilly stated an invitation to attend an open house at the Sussex County Communications Center on January 26th was received from Sheriff Strada and it was distributed to the Governing Body. An RSVP is required by January 21st.

<u>*JIF Loss Control Inspection*</u> – Administrator McNeilly reported that the DPW Department passed the annual inspection with flying colors. The inspector noted the employee doorway is in poor shape and needs to be replaced. Considering all the facilities, equipment, parks and vehicles the Borough has, this was an excellent report.

<u>Condo Service 2014</u> – Administrator McNeilly stated he has received the data from Bill Storms, DPW Superintendent, which is necessary to begin preparing the 2014 reimbursement report. The agreements for solid waste and recycling should be complete due to the fact there have been no increases. Administrator McNeilly stated the only change this year will be the calculation for the brine which will affect the amount of salt use. The information will be provided to Mr. Stein. Mayor Maio asked how the condominiums costs for recycling are calculated versus the Borough's costs. Administrator McNeilly replied the costs are based on the contract agreement and the reimbursement will be the lesser of the two costs.

<u>Accounts Payable/Construction Secretary</u> – Administrator McNeilly stated he and the CFO should have a recommendation for the Accounts Payable/Construction Secretary position available for the next Mayor and Council meeting.

<u>Vacant Properties</u> – Administrator McNeilly stated a list of vacant properties has been prepared by the Code Enforcement Officer and copies have been provided to the Governing Body. Administrator McNeilly has also provided any legal action pending on the properties. The Code Enforcement Officer has issued several notices of violation. Much discussion took place regarding the various vacant residences. Mayor Maio asked if payments are being made on the Ridge Road property that the Borough holds a mortgage on. Administrator McNeilly confirmed payments are being made but the Borough should consult with Mr. Stein regarding foreclosure. Administrator McNeilly stated some of the properties have reverse mortgages, some are in foreclosure, others have no action taking place and some have extremely large mortgages on them. Some homes have been purchased and are doing well. Administrator McNeilly stated the list has also been provided to the Fire Department.

Administrator McNeilly stated the owner of the home located on the left hand side at Stonegate Village has been in to speak with Tom Pershouse, Construction Official, regarding the demolition permits. Mayor Maio stated Mr. Pershouse informed her that he cannot issue demolition permits until soil conservation permits are in place. Councilwoman Kuncken stated the owner of the property appeared before the Land Use Board several years ago. Mayor Maio stated the final approval was on hold until arrangements could be made with Stonegate's Board for permission to join the association.

Administrator McNeilly stated the number of vacant homes has not lessened. There is legislation which allows for municipalities to require registration of abandoned homes. Mayor Maio stated Mr. Pershouse has recommended that the Borough adopt an ordinance requiring registration. A registration fee of \$50 could be charged and a placard would have to be placed on the residence with contact information that must be kept current. The companies are now changing the contacts and trying to locate the parties responsible is difficult. If the residence is still vacant a year later the fee can increase to \$100 and the third year a fee of \$2,000 could be set. This may prevent the banks from letting the properties sit vacant. Mayor Maio stated the Governing Body should discuss the registration issue with Mr. Stein at the next scheduled meeting.

Councilman Romano asked for the status of the Old Morris Canal property. Administrator McNeilly stated part of that property was sold years ago to the home owner across the street. Administrator McNeilly stated the Zoning Officer receives many calls regarding this property. Several have inquired about rebuilding a restaurant. The kitchens are gone, parking is no longer available and a liquor license is not available for the property. The price has been reduced to \$199,000. The last time the property was sold the cost was \$1.1 million. Much discussion took place regarding the current condition of the property.

<u>Budget</u> – Administrator McNeilly stated the budget books have been prepared. The revenue section is not available at this time. Values have not been obtained from the Tax Assessor and the water and sewer information and capital are not included. Mayor Maio stated work should begin as soon as possible on the budget. The Governing Body agreed to hold a Special Budget Meeting on January 20th at 5:30 P.M. Administrator McNeilly stated he would like to include the appointment of the new hire to the meeting agenda. Mayor Maio asked the Deputy Clerk to inform the Clerk of the meeting date to be advertised.

<u>Surplus Equipment</u> – Administrator McNeilly stated there were some items that did not sell at the surplus equipment auction specifically chairs and a television. Councilwoman Zdichocki suggested donating them to the restore or veterans. Mayor Maio suggested contacting the

American Legion, Ambulance Squad, Fire Department or churches to determine if they could make use of the items.

Accordingly, the new assessor, Jason Laliker, is hereby appointed to a term commencing on January 1, 2015 with a four year term to commence on July 1, 2015 expiring on June 30, 2019;
