ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator McNeilly reminded the Governing Body of the Open House on March 16, 2015 sponsored by Sheriff Strada. The Open House will be from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 pm. Anyone interested in attending should inform the Deputy Clerk who will RSVP for the Borough officials.

Administrator McNeilly informed the Governing Body that there is a public officials' preconstruction meeting for the Route 183/Route 206 overlay project scheduled for tomorrow at 10:30 a.m. at the Roxbury Municipal Building. Administrator McNeilly will attend the meeting. The Governing Body asked the Administrator, while at the meeting, to bring to their attention the "dip" in the road as you turn off Route 183 onto Main Street.

WORK SESSION

Resolution Re: Restoration of Funding to State Park Programs – Mayor Maio noted a copy of the resolution adopted by the Board of Chosen Freeholders was distributed. It has been requested that a similar resolution be adopted by the Governing Body. Council agreed to have the resolution prepared for adoption by the Governing Body.

<u>American Legion Memorial Day Parade</u> – Mayor Maio stated the American Legion has requested permission to conduct their annual Memorial Day Parade. Council agreed to grant the request. A resolution granting permission for the Memorial Day Parade will be put on the next meeting agenda.

Marc Clawson Request (Linden Avenue Sidewalk) – Mayor Maio noted an email was received from Mr. Clawson regarding an issue with his children's bus stop being at the section of Linden Avenue where there is no sidewalk and he questioned why the sidewalk does not continue to the end. Mayor Maio deferred discussion to the Administrator. Administrator McNeilly gave a brief history of the 1994/1995 Linden Avenue project that included Belgian Block curbing and having the sidewalks redone. There are two houses on Linden Avenue (passed the Ambulance Squad building) that have very little parking. At the

time of the project a concern was raised since those residents park their cars at the end of the road and it was agreed to continue to provide that portion for parking. The Borough offers no maintenance of that area. The cars park parallel to the road and you would not be able to park there if a sidewalk was installed. Mayor Maio asked if this information was communicated to Mr. Clawson. Administrator McNeilly responded in the affirmative. The Governing Body discussed the issue of the bus stop being at a location on Linden Avenue where there is no sidewalk. Councilwoman Zdichocki suggested contacting someone about moving the bus stop to a new location, i.e. Church and Main Street. Administrator McNeilly offered to contact the Administrator of Stanhope School about changing the location of the bus stop. Mayor Maio stated it is not a Stanhope School bus, it is a Byram School bus and expressed her opinion that it is not within the purview of the Governing Body. Administrator McNeilly said he will, as a courtesy, reach out to the school and ask if there is something that can be done to accommodate the students. Mayor Maio stated she would prefer if Mr. Clawson contact the school since it is not the responsibility of the Governing Body to get involved with school transportation. Administrator McNeilly will contact Mr. Clawson and encourage him to contact the school about the bus stop.

<u>SCMUA – Proposed Grinnell Recycling Inc. SWMP Amendment</u> – Mayor Maio noted the letter received from SCMUA regarding Grinnell. Mayor Maio stated this is going to become an issue and it is her opinion that there should be a resolution drafted and sent to SWAC and the Freeholders opposing any further accommodations to Grinnell. Council agreed. Administrator McNeilly will contact Mr. Stein and ask that the resolution be prepared for adoption at the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Maio stated the Finance Committee met earlier today with Ray Sarinelli, the Borough's Auditor, to review the budget and discuss some concerns of Mr. Sarinelli based solely on the potential for debt service in years ahead. In 2016 and 2017 the Borough will have substantial debt to repay. They reduced that amount of money from \$70,000 to \$40,000 which covers the one-time items in the budget and reduced the budget by an additional \$21,500. They took \$7,500 out of flow control and \$5,000 out of COAH. They reduced the amount of money that was being put back in the budget which increased the tax levy to 0.95% and a payment to the average homeowner of \$18.00. Mayor Maio explained Mr. Sarinelli's concern was, if we use the money towards operating expenses, we would be better off holding it and looking at it as money to pay off debt as it comes due. The CFO re-run the cover page of the budget so Council has the final report. Mayor Maio stated the Finance Committee was in agreement with Mr. Sarinelli's recommendations. Councilwoman Kuncken stated Mr. Sarinelli has always been cautious and he put the Borough on a path years ago with respect to managing debt and we have managed our debt well. Mr. Sarinelli was concerned because you do not want your notes to have to be converted to bonds and you do not want to rely on them for operating expenses. If notes are not paid off in 10 years, they must be converted to bonds. Council agreed with Mr. Sarinelli's recommendations and the changes made to the budget.

Resolution 067-15 SELF-EXAMINATION OF BUDGET RESOLUTION [as required by DCA]

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 through 7.5, the *Borough of Stanhope* has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local government Services, and the Chief Financial officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2015 budget year.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the *Borough of Stanhope* that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
 - 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
 - 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.
