Sanitarian:

Activity report received. Copies of reports placed on file.

13 Delaware - old septic tank abandonment. County required a pump out receipt and tank is crushed and filled in.

Dollar General- report of rancid prepackaged cupcake. NJ State Department of Health has been contacted along with the manufacture so they can test the product. Person who purchased and eat one of the cupcakes filed a complaint with the County and also contacted Tasty Cake. Tasty cake was aware of the problem. Sounds like they located the batch number and linked it to an existing test that they had done. Store is not at fault. Issue could be with quality or packaging. NJ doesn't enforce expiration dates on prepackage items because they are very processed.

Animal Control Officer:

No reports received.

Zackary provided quarantine paperwork from ACO about dog bite.

Chipmunk bite- ACO informed the County and recommended to parents that they take child to the doctor. The County said that chipmunks don't carry rabies. Zack said he believes it's because of their size, they would parish from the disease.

Dog that was surrendered was adopted.

Hopatcong pound is operational.

Secretary:

Conference call- Spoke about Breast Health Density. There's a free clinic in Sussex County for eligible women and a clinic in Newton for people without insurance. An ultrasound is needed if breast are very dense.

Powassan Survey- surveying 300 households in towns close to the four cases. Blood test results will be available to participants.

No bills to be paid.


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Since there was no further business to transact, the members voted to adjourn 7:37p.m.
