Lakeland Little League and Patriot Field Snack Shack - missing test strips and told not to use sponges.

Express Fuel and Speedy Mart - received complaints about business selling vape to minors. Spoke to clerks at both businesses and both stated they monitor ID's. Reminded them that selling tobacco/vaping products to anyone under 21 is illegal and would involve enforcement if violation were to be observed.

7 Kelly Place - Rodent complaint. was allowed access to the property and did not observe rodent burrows on property. It should be noted that there are new owner and they were working on the house which can stir things up. No further actions required by SCDH at this time.

7 Kelly Place - Rodent complaint - Was unable to gain access to rear of the property. Did not observe rodent burrows in the front yard. No further actions required by SCDH at this time. Notice on house stating it is being taken care of by the States. He called the State and explained that he didn't see evidence of rodents but asked that they have property treated. Zackary was asked to update the person who filed the complaint and check if she is still seeing any rodents. Zackary didn't see any burrows but they could be underground and he can't do anything unless he sees it. Home owner is no longer in residence. Dog biscuit can be seen on the counter.

Express Mart- serves repackaged food.


