### **Citizens to be Heard**

#### **Sanitarian:**

Activity report received. Copies of reports placed on file.

Received call from homeowner about New World Development vehicle broke down and fluid leaking from vehicle.

Zack spoke to owner of New World Construction and he verified that it happen and it was hydraulic fluid. Zack checked and it didn't look like anything reached the drain. They had applied speedy dry right away. Zack spoke to someone who was on site when it happened. They described it as a pin hole in one of the hoses, it was less than five gallons and they were able to clean it up.

Stanhope House was inspected and the only concern was an overhead light needed to be shielded.

American Legion was inspected and there were no violations.

Black Forest Inn was inspected and there was an issue with the dishwasher but they had someone come service it that day.

Little League gets inspected in the summer normally when they inspect the schools. The schools get inspected twice a year.

County Dog bite reports are now included in our County reports. Zack didn't have any information on them and M. McNeilly called to get information about calls but hasn't heard back.

#### **Animal Control Officer:**

Received bill for one call regarding deceased cat with no CAD report. Also on the invoice was a statement about a Vet bill be on our next billing. If the cat was deceased why would there be a Vet bill? There was some confusion about bill so the Board decided to hold onto the bill until we get more information. The person who previously responded to our request for a bill has changed.
