9 & 18 Valley Rd- Both properties where inspected for possible rat issues. Inspector was given access to the properties by the contractor and found no holes, rodents or entryways. This was the second inspection for 9 Valley Rd. Complaint received from Rosa Taddei who lives at the corner of Valley Rd and Elm St. Zoning Officer also inspected both properties and found no evidence of rodents. When inspecting property without permission by the owner the inspector can only inspect what they can see from the street to the front door. When inspecting a property and no one is home they place a sticker requesting the home owner contact them and schedule an inspection. Hopefully the people call or they try to catch them at home so they can walk the property. Stanhope School does have a dumpster close to 22 Valley Rd. The school dumpsters are inspected when the school is inspected. The school was just inspected and it's stated in the report that they have a pest management company who comes out once a month.


