Dear Community Group Leader:

Please see attached our flyer for our upcoming Arbor Day/Clean Communities Day Event on Sunday, April 28th from 12:30 – 3:30 PM; with a Rain Date of Sunday, May 5th. To make this year's Clean Communities Day a success, we will be using money from the Clean Communities Grant to award \$200.00 mini-grants to eligible volunteer (non-profit) groups *located in the Borough of Stanhope*, who participate in this year's event. Volunteer groups are defined as: the Cub Scouts, Boy and/or Girl Scouts, church, school, or civic groups and other similar organized groups. Although grants are committed to non-profit groups in town, individuals are welcome to participate voluntarily.

Guidelines to receive this grant are:

- 1. A minimum of 6 participants from each group/organization must be in attendance. (2 hours of work must be done by each member). Participants can represent only one group.
- 2. All trash is to be picked up; excluding large or potentially dangerous items. Clear trash bags are to be used for recyclables; and black plastic bags are to be used for trash. All trash bags need to be returned to a designated area.
- 3. You must have 1 adult to supervise every 6 children, who are 12 years of age and younger.

The Stanhope Environmental & Shade Tree Commissions will provide the following:

- 1. Table and sign-in sheets with a Clean Communities Supervisor to provide instructions and assistance.
- 2. Bottled water. (Participants should bring any snacks/medications they may require).
- 3. All necessary equipment: gloves, bags, shovels, rakes, pick-up sticks.
- 4. Designate areas for the trash to be picked up.

<u>Please fill out the group application form</u> on the next page and return it to the contact person, in order for us to have enough gloves/water, and to have the vouchers prepared for you to sign immediately upon completion of the Clean-Up. More importantly, please hand out the Waiver Forms and Safety Guidelines for participants to review prior to the clean up. We will have extra forms on site for last minute participants.

Please note that this year, we will all meet at Valley Road School and your group may be asked to disperse to a different location in town to expand our clean-up efforts. Safety and Other Guidelines for All Participants

What to do first: Check-in at the pick-up site at Valley Road School – 24 Valley Rd. Stanhope. Water will be provided at check-in, if needed.

Clothing:

- Wear long-sleeved shirts, jeans or long pants, leather or heavy soled shoes, or boots.
- Dress for the weather! Gloves will be provided on site.

Emergency Information/ First Aid: Be sure to inform your group leader or site coordinator of any **known allergies** and physical infirmities prior to participation. (If you are prescribed an Epi-pen/Inhaler by your doctor, please carry it with you during the clean up). A basic first aid kit will be on site at the check-in, if needed. **Drink plenty of water and take breaks as needed.** Water will be provided at check-in, if needed.

Be alert for hazards:

- Learn to identify **poison ivy**. The recommended attire will prevent irritations from most plants.
- Be alert for bees, wasps, hornets, fire ants, and snakes.
- Pay attention to handling of **broken glass**.
- Cancel pick-up during **extreme weather** conditions.
- Avoid car batteries, animal carcasses, and unidentifiable or questionable items. If you find abandoned drums or pails, do not touch or move them
- * Toxic or bulky waste should be identified, its location should be noted, and a report should be given to the site coordinator.

Traffic.

- Be sure you are **visible** to motorists.
- Watch for **unexpected developments** in traffic.
- Walk facing oncoming traffic.

Youths: Provide appropriate and adequate adult supervision when youth groups are involved.

Avoid Unsafe Behavior: All unsafe behavior, such as standing or jumping on guardrails, drainage pipes, or concrete walls, horseplay and demonstrations should not be permitted.

Recyclables will be placed in clear plastic bags and trash into other bags provided. All bags will be securely tied. Examples of Recyclable Litter:

- Aluminum beverage cans
- Clear, brown, and green glass
- Plastic soda bottles, milk jugs, and liquid detergent bottles
- Tires
- Automobile parts mufflers, tailpipes, hubcaps, and rims
- Batteries dry cell
- Scrap metal

Place garbage bags at requested locations and.... CHECK OUT when done, so we don't unnecessarily start a search party for you!

Finally, be sure to.. Check yourself for ticks and remove ticks immediately. If tick is feeding, use tweezers as close to skin as possible, and consult a physician if the tick appears to be engorged or if you develop a bulls-eye rash.
