The Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority conducts 2 **free*** Household Hazardous Waste events each year for Sussex County residents. Events are held to ensure residents properly dispose of hazardous materials and keep them out of the landfill.

Residents are encouraged to read labels prior to purchasing products, and avoid those that are flammable, corrosive or toxic. If there are no non-toxic alternatives, buy and use limited quantities.

The hazardous waste program is NOT open to businesses and commercial establishments.

***Limits: 100 pounds of dry waste, and/or 10 gallons of liquid waste and 25 fluorescent bulbs. Additional quantities incur a scale charge of \$1.79/lb.**

Do NOT Bring:

**Latex Paint / Motor Oil
Asbestos / PCBs
Picric Acid / Explosives

Radioactive materials
Compressed Gas Cylinders
Empty containers /
Unknowns**

Latex paint cans (dried)
Propane cylinders (1 & 20 lb.)

Recycling Center (free)

Used motor oil (5-gallon limit)
Antifreeze (5-gallon limit)
